

Break Out of the Compromise Rut

Joyful are people of integrity, who follow the instructions of the LORD. They do not compromise with evil, and they walk only in his paths. Psalm 119:1, 3, NLT

Sometimes when we compromise and do something we know is wrong or questionable, we think we're gaining an advantage with people, we're getting their approval and acceptance. But that's all we're getting. When you walk in integrity, when you live by what God says in His Word and don't lower that standard, you're gaining an advantage with God.

His favour on your life will take you much further than having an advantage with people. We may cut corners here and compromise there, but it's only going to hurt us in the long run. The Promise of Good Things.

“Sovereign LORD, you are God! Your covenant is trustworthy, and You have promised these good things to your servant.” 2 Samuel 7:28, NIV

If you have a child who's off course, you can live worried and believe the lies that he's never going to do right. Or you can say, “God, You reign over him. TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call Him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").
Matthew 1:22–23, NIV

TODAY'S WORD: All the things that Mary went through were to fulfil the prophecy that was spoken through the prophet Isaiah hundreds of years previous. She had to get pregnant at what seemed to be the wrong time—she wasn't married and nearly lost Joseph in the process.

It was prophesied that Jesus would be born in Bethlehem, which meant that Caesar Augustus had to call for a census to get them from Nazareth to Bethlehem at seemingly the wrong time—she was nine months pregnant, had to travel by donkey, and there were no rooms available when they got there. All these wrongs were necessary; they were prophesied.

Can I tell you there is a prophecy over your life? There are things God has ordained for you to do that He's already written in His book before time began. As with Mary, you're not going to understand everything that happens; it may seem wrong. It's all necessary. It's leading you to the birth, to the promise, to things bigger than you can imagine; to favour, influence, and opportunity as you've never seen.

Thank You that I can trust You when things seem wrong, knowing that You have ordained them for me. 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
It is our custom to welcome all visitors to our services.

Condolences are extended to bereaved families. We remember before God all those who mourn the loss of loved family members, friends and colleagues.



Jonah who hated the powerful and wicked Assyrians was called by God to warn these people that they would receive judgement if they did not repent.

Jonah did not want to go to Nineveh so he turned and ran away from God but God has ways of teaching us to obey and follow him so when Jonah finally preached there the city repented and God withheld his Judgement. So, the most wicked will be saved if they repent for, their sins and turn to God. The reluctant preacher went to Nineveh. Here we see God's acts of compassion at work.





Their assets may have a total with several zero's. Yet it does not suffice which is fuelled by an unending desire to have more and to do so by any means necessary. Then there are those whom we may estimate to possess barely anything and who yet reflect a totally different posture. For them, the goal in life is not to get as much as one can, but rather to give as much as one can.

In all four Gospels we read about Jesus feeding a crowd and each account has its own unique slant on the actions and on the crowd size. But one thing that is common throughout each story is that with Jesus we see a miraculous movement FROM LITTLE TO LEFTOVERS. My attention today though is drawn to the account in John 6: 1 – 14. In that instance we see that it is the little which was given by a boy which was the contributor to the leftovers.

Sometimes in our reading of these accounts, it is easy to overlook the boy and his generosity. But I invite us to look even further beyond the boy and consider the home from which he came. Did he pack the food for himself? Or was it with him because his mom or dad wanted to ensure that he had something to eat during the day. I wondered to myself if this was his school lunch and had he in fact skipped out of school for the day to go and listen to Jesus. Even if he was at a place where he should not have been, his release of the little he had resulted in a miraculous catering experience. Because of this boy, we see a powerful example when things can go FROM LITTLE TO LEFTOVERS.

The same might be said of countless cities across the world. There are contrasting realities where there are those who have very little or worse yet, nothing at all.

Yet, we also know that there are those who have so much that they don’t even know what to do with the excess that exists. In fact, it might be said that they have too much.
