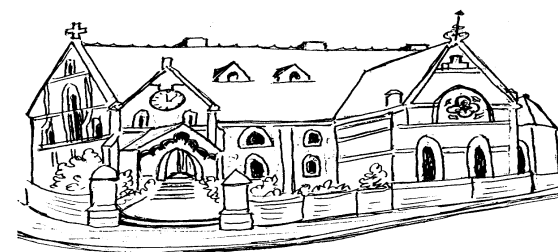

Discover Your Wings: He was like an eagle hovering over its nest, overshadowing its young, Then spreading its wings, lifting them into the air, teaching them to fly.

Deuteronomy 32:11, MSG

Today's Word: For the eaglet, the nest is a blessing for a time. High on a cliff, it's safe, comfortable, well taken care of. Life is good. But at a certain point, the nest will no longer be a blessing; it will be a hindrance. The eaglet can only develop so far in the nest, and if the mother doesn't stir things up and make it uncomfortable, it won't learn to fly or to survive. Sometimes the nest we're in is too small.

As much as we like it, it's limiting our ability. You're comfortable, provided for, protected, but the problem is you'll never discover your wings in the nest. You'll never reach your potential without having to stretch, try new things, develop new muscles. You may think, "What's happening?"

Things have changed, and it's more difficult. My friend walked away, and my coworker won't help me anymore." You may not like the stirring, but it's God working in your life to help you discover your wings and learn to fly. When He does, don't shrink back. You're going to rise to levels you never thought possible.

Negative Chatter: Whoever belittles his neighbour lacks sense, but a man of understanding remains silent.
Proverbs 11:12, ESV (English Standard Version)

TODAY'S WORD: Everyone gets negative chatter. Not everyone is going to accept or approve of you. They'll make remarks trying to humiliate and bait you into conflict. The enemy would love to get you off course, offended, trying to straighten people out and prove to them that you're okay. Don't get involved in battles that are not between you and your destiny.

Don't make the mistake of trying to please everyone. Don't get sidetracked trying to win people over who are never going to be for you. All that does is waste your time. Your job is to not try to make people like you or to try to change people's minds about you. Your job is to run your race, to be who God has called you to be, and not worry about the critics and the naysayers. God will cause the right people to be for you.

The good old King James' Version of the bible that we all grew up with, renders that verse this way, "And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed."

The original Greek when translated also uses the word 'census'. However, the ultimate goal even for the census on the part of the decree was so that those who had been counted could now be taxed. The actions of the Roman Emperor had ramifications throughout the then world.

‘As the World Turns’ (ATWT) was an American television soap opera that ran from April 2, 1956 to September 17, 2010. For those who may not at all be familiar with this genre of entertainment, it is basically one continuous story, filled with more than enough melodrama with the same cast of characters and personalities.

Each daily episode ends with a cliff hanger and as such keeps drawing you back in each day to see what will happen next. ATWT was only one of the countless soap operas and each of the major US television stations featured their own soap operas. Some are actually still running. I am sure that some people are familiar with names such as General Hospital,

The Young and Restless, The Bold and Beautiful and Days of our Lives, just to name a few. If you remember the Peyton Place soap opera, then you are definitely a senior member of society!!

While soap operas are generally known to be scripted by Hollywood writers and producers, we expect to find melodrama. After all, these are actors and actresses, who have memorized their lines and are following the director’s orders. But since January 20, 2025, it appears as though the whole world has been forced to be viewers and consumers of a soap opera type of leadership and governance being enacted by the US.

Smoking, drinking, abuse, peer pressure and drug misuse. These situations are most confusing and terrifying for motherhood, as growing up requires an understanding of the world. Grooming a young person at this stage only needs the intervention of the Lord.
